TRAFFIC MANAGEMENT

Burnley Road

Traffic lights will be in place on Burnley Road from 9th May. We have been working with specialist suppliers to minimise the inconvenience caused by traffic management. Bluetooth technology will be used to monitor the queues more accurately and provide data on the journey times between specific points. Traffic management will be required along Burnley Road until the scheme is complete in Winter 2019/20. We understand the inconvenience that traffic lights can cause and we appreciate your patience.

Caldene Avenue

Work will be commencing next week on Caldene Avenue and will also require traffic management to be in place. The first part of this work requires service diversions and will take around 16 weeks. Once this work is complete, it will enable us to create a new temporary lane on Caldene Avenue, remove the traffic management and maintain a two-way flow of traffic whilst work continues.

CONSTRUCTION UPDATE

Work continues upstream of the viaduct at Cragg Brook. The new stone will weather over time and the colour will eventually blend in with the existing wall.

As part of the work to build flood defence walls we will temporarily need to remove the footbridge across Cragg Brook. This will take place around 9th May and the bridge will be replaced in August.
